Distance Education Instructional Method definitions:

Desktop Video Conferencing - DVC: identified as Live Streaming in the Attribute schedule. DVC classes allow students to participate in a real time class meeting from the originating campus classroom (shown as Live Streaming From) or live streaming from a computer with high-speed internet. Web conferencing software provides the capability for two-way audio, video, and chat for interaction with the instructor and other students. Students may use their personal computer or make arrangements to use a campus computer, which is limited to a camera, if available, and chat function (no microphones). Students should bring their own earbud/earphone when live streaming from a campus location. Students taking DVC courses for the first time will be required to attend a DVC Orientation at the location shown in their schedule. A college representative will be available at each live streaming location to assist students to download the DVC software, and log in to the class virtually during the first class meeting. Students who have previously taken a DVC course may go to the course in Online Campus to obtain the DVC course link and attend the class virtually. Students may be required to come to the originating campus location or to the nearest campus to take an exam.

Hybrid courses combine synchronous classroom instruction with computer-based online learning. In a Hybrid course half of the course learning is done online, and half in a classroom setting.

Columbia State WEB-Asynchronous courses are delivered using a learning management system, no on-ground instruction. Communication and instruction take place through Brightspace D2L with focus on student-to-student and instructor-to-student interaction. Courses are available 24/7, however, courses have assignment and test due dates just like there are in any other class. Students may be required to come to a Testing Center to take a proctored exam (in person). These courses are developed and taught by Columbia State faculty.

TN eCampus - WEB Asynchronous courses taught by instructors from Tennessee Board of Regents colleges and universities all across the state of Tennessee. Courses are available 24/7, with assignment and test due dates, just like there are in any other class. Students may be required to come to a Testing Center to take a proctored (in person) mid-term and/or final exam.

Two-Way Video and Audio – (ITV) course use specialized equipment for transmission of video and audio to several campus locations at once. Although teaching in only one of the classrooms, the instructor and students at all locations are able to interact through the video and audio system.
